## **Summary of Fall Activities**

<u>Apple Harvest Festival</u> -- Retzer's premier event was held on September 22<sup>nd</sup>, and included the popular Passport Expedition, craft beer garden, vendor booths, live music, and of course, lots of apples and apple products. The Friends organized hayrides, children's games and crafts, a used book sale, a children's Reading Corner, and a silent auction. Over 1900 carloads of people came and enjoyed a day with beautiful weather conditions and lots of attractions.

#### The Friends Board Welcomes Two New Partners

With the retirements of Larry Kascht and Duane Grimm last July, two new faces have joined our Friends' Board at monthly planning meetings: Janet Barthel and Rebecca Mattano. Both have brought an impressive set of credentials to the table; but of equal importance, both have brought an enthusiasm, thoughtfulness and passion for making Retzer Nature Center a valued destination for years to come, and have sought to nurture many of the traditions and ideas generated by their two predecessors.

Janet Barthel is Retzer's newly appointed *Nature Center Supervisor*, responsible for the supervision and advanced professional work involving programs, research projects, education and operations at Retzer. Duties include supporting and equipping her team to successfully

address daily tasks at hand and seasonal initiatives, plus maintaining essential connections with Waukesha Parks System staff, the Friends of Retzer Board, and Retzer Trained Naturalists. Her previous work as Park Naturalist and Educational Naturalist at Retzer positioned her well for her new administrative position.

Janet grew up in Rockford, Illinois, and received her undergraduate degree in Biological Sciences at Illinois State University, followed by certifications as a Master Gardener and Master Naturalist. She moved up to Wisconsin years ago when her husband, Paul, took a job as a civil engineer with Waukesha County. Their oldest daughter, Emily, is an RN in Minneapolis, youngest daughter, Elizabeth, is pursuing admittance to veterinary school in Michigan, and son, Sam, is working on a PhD in Kinesiology at Michigan State University. Her hobbies and outdoor interests include hiking, gardening, and cooking, and she cites Yosemite as her current favorite national park destination.

When asked what attracted her to the new position, she replied, "The opportunity was given to me to use my strengths in a broader way to support environmental educational in Waukesha County...and to have an impact through leading my team with a greater vision of the Environmental Education Team, the Parks Division, and the County." Though she misses actually leading a program with a school group, she is encouraged to step back and observe her gifted team of staff and volunteers implement quality environmental education programming to so many diverse visitor groups. She added, "The longer I am in this new role, my respect for what the Friends of Retzer Nature Center do and have done continues to grow. I am in awe of their passion and determination to support what happens at this place, from financial and volunteer needs to heartfelt advice for me personally...I'm forever grateful."

Rebecca Mattano is Waukesha County's new *Park System Manager*. Her duties include supervising, coordinating, and administering the planning, development and park operations for the county's park system and ice arenas. In addition, she manages and mentors a strong support team whose focus is on continuous improvement of the aforementioned facilities. She is well versed in countywide programming, having previously served as Solid Waste Supervisor for Waukesha County, where she administered operations, budgets, grants, and partnerships of the solid waste program, including the material recovery facility, hazardous waste, yard waste, and electronics/appliance recycling programs.

Rebecca grew up in Oconomowoc, Wisconsin, and received her undergraduate degree in Conservation and Environmental Science at UW-Milwaukee, followed by a Master's degree in Natural Resources at UW-Stevens Point. Her interest and training in environmental education led to several years of service as an instructor in the Environmental Sciences program at Carroll University before she moved on to her professional positions with Waukesha County. Hobbies and outdoor interests include hiking, running, swimming, skiing, traveling, and recreating with her family, and cites Moose Lake as her favorite getaway spot.

When asked what attracted her to her new position, she responded, "The opportunity to be part of a dynamic team of dedicated professionals working collaboratively to shape the future of the park system through focus on the protection, enhancement and enjoyment of our natural resources." When asked what she enjoys most about her new job, she comments, "The team! Each person working for the park system is invested in the success of others and the parks. We focus on helping each other and addressing continuous improvement initiatives that save money and improve operational efficiencies." Finally, regarding her relationship with the Friends, she adds, "We are fortunate to have the support of the Friends of Retzer Nature Center.
