## **Upcoming Nature Center Events**

- <u>Retzer's Spring Workshop</u> is set for <u>Saturday</u>, <u>March 16</u> from 9am-noon. Invited presenters will address topics and issues relating to plant composting.
- <u>EARTH WEEK</u>: Commemorative activities are planned at Retzer on <u>Saturday</u>, <u>April 20</u> from 10am-1pm, including a birding hike, adventure hike and Story Hike on the nature center trails. In addition, free viewings in the Horwitz-DeRemer Planetarium of "Our Violent Planet" will be shown.
