• (*Saturday, September 10*) *Literatus Bookstore outreach event in Watertown:* Retzer staff naturalist Jacci Jenks brought several live critters and hands-on materials for her kids'show-and-tell presentations. The Friends also added an information table to promote the nature center and our organization to residents in Jefferson County.

(Saturday, September 17, 9am-4pm) Retzer's Apple Harvest Festival: Over 1400 cars full of area residents attended the Friends' largest sponsored event of the year on a weather perfect mild, sunny day. The popular Apple Market featured over 20 varieties of fresh picked apples -- plus apple pies, apple crisp, apple cider, and caramel apples. Nearby, vendors lined the drive with their craft tents, Delafield Brewhaus offered a multitude of refreshments, and JC Ayer provided music entertainment. The newly dedicated Discovery Trail was a magnet for kids of all ages, and included a Passport Expedition with several points of interest. Friends volunteers raised over \$3000 through their impressive silent auction and used and new book sale, plus distributed over 1000 free raffle tickets to visitors for hourly planetarium, gift shop, membership and apple pie prizes. All in all, it was a great day for a great cause!

- (Thursday, October 6 to Saturday, October 8) Wisconsin Summit for Natural Resources Volunteers: The Friends served as Silver Sponsors for the event, which was held at various sites in Waukesha County, including Retzer Nature Center. The meeting attracted 230 nature center volunteers, citizen scientists, field researchers, environmental educators, and natural resource specialists, and was a great opportunity for the Waukesha County Parks System and Retzer Nature Center to be highlighted.
- (Saturday, November 5) Retzer Science Fest: Co-sponsored with Generac, the theme of this year's event was "Inside and Out," with opportunity for families to investigate various aspects of nature from micro to macro scale. Admission was free for Friends members. Outdoor activity on the blustery day included Discovery Trail hikes and bird walks. Indoor activity included hands-on topics ranging from pond life to urban runoff to leaf blight to forest critters, plus entertaining Mad Scientist demonstrations. Thanks to the students from Pewaukee High School and employees from Generac who volunteered at the science stations. Over 100 local residents attended the event.
